

In 1985 the Crescent Society was moved to the Benhill Allotment Site and amalgamated with the Benhill allotment holders. Benhill-Crescent Horticultural Society has almost 300 members, who appreciate the facilities on site and the Trading Hut and participate in the many activities offered by the volunteer members who run the Society.

Affiliation

The Society is affiliated to national and local organisations including;

Loan of Tools

There is a selection of tools available for Benhill Allotment-holders to borrow for use on their plots, including rotavators, strimmers, back-saver spades and mowers. Tools are stored at the site and are available for allotment holders to use on a Sunday morning or at other times by arrangement. Please ask at the Trading Hut.

Please note that tools are loaned at members' own risk. A demonstration of use is given and safety equipment is provided for members to use but the Society can accept no liability for injury.

The Society in indebted to <u>Brian Martin</u> for his work in maintaining the tools.

A financial contribution towards petrol and running costs is invited when you borrow the equipment. It is expected that tools are returned clean and ready for use by another member by 12:15pm. Please report any damage or malfunctioning of equipment on return.

Whether you are serious about showing, growing or having fun, the society has something for everyone

Showing

There are two Shows each year, the first, held in July includes Spud in a Tub.



Benhill Allotment Holders Show mid July and 'Spud-in-a-Tub' Competition

If you are interested in 'showing' your produce ask for a copy of the Schedule in the Trading Hut. These are available at the end of January. The Schedule includes fruit, vegetables and flowers. There are classes for children, too, which are free to enter.

('Spud in a Tub is open to all members)

The "Gordon Bennett" Trophy is awarded to the grower of the greatest total weight of potatoes grown from a single seed potato.

The smallest entry will win the 'Tryarda Trophy'.

'Spud' Rules

- A different variety of potato is selected by the show committee each year.
- Members can purchase as many entries as they wish from the Trading Hut from January.
- Entries are provided as a seed potato and a black plastic grow bag.
- All potatoes must be grown from the seed potato provided. (Potatoes grown from other varieties will be disqualified)
- All potatoes must be grown in the plastic poly bag provided.
- Growers can choose the growing medium and method
- All entries must be brought to the weigh-in still in the poly bag as grown. (Tops can be removed.)

The Autumn Show at Benhill Allotment Site

The second show in the year is in September and is held at the Benhill Allotment Site. This show is open to all our members.

If you are interested in 'showing' please ask for a copy of the Schedule in the Trading Hut.

The Schedule includes a variety of classes for showing; photography, baking, flower arranging, handicrafts as well as fruit, vegetables and flowers. There are classes for children, too, which are free to enter.

Best Allotment Competition

Judging for these awards takes place in the summer and trophies are presented at the September Show

Trophies are awarded for the following:

- a) best lady allotment holder
- b) best novice plot
- c) best 125 m2 allotment
- d) best 250 m2 allotment



The Allotment Shop

The shop is run by volunteer members for the benefit of all members. Any profit is used to improve the services provided.

An extensive range of items is stocked for every aspect of horticulture, both usual and specialist. These are on sale at competitive prices. Cheques and credit / debit cards are accepted in the shop.

Many items are purchased in bulk by the society and re-packaged in smaller sizes so that members can benefit from low prices.

- Plants both flowers and vegetable depending on season
 - Fish Food
 - Plant Pots of varying sizes and type
